Mayor Esposito called the September 24, 2024, Regular and Committee of the Whole Meeting of the City Council to order at 7:00 P.M.

Also in attendance: City Administrator J. Ritz, Assistant to the City Administrator A. Raffel, Police Chief C. Calvello, Deputy Chief D. Clark, Sergeant M. Hylton, and City Attorney R. Ramello.

III. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Esposito led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance.

IV. ADDITIONS OR DELETIONS TO THE AGENDA

Mayor Esposito asked for the removal of Committee of the Whole #1 Presentation Of The City Of Oakbrook Terrace 2024–2027 Strategic Plan By Northern Illinois University. He stated that due to an illness, Assistant Director Melissa Henricksen would not be able to attend and will move the presentation to the November 12th City Council Meeting.

Mayor Esposito then asked for the removal from the Committee of the Whole #5 Draft Ordinance Amending The Provisions Of Section 33.008 Entitled “Departments, Boards, And Commissions” Of Title III Entitled “Administration” Of The Code Of Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois, Providing For Police Commanders. He stated that this ordinance needs to be discussed in contract negotiations with the Labor Union prior to coming before City Council.

VI. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Resident Don Ventura addressed the City Council regarding the Streambank Restoration Project. He expressed concern that newly planted vegetation was dying due to insufficient watering and inquired about the city's plans to water the plants to improve their chances of survival.

Resident David Brown addressed the City Council, expressing concern about his calculation of \$1.3 million in lost revenue from the city's invested reserves. He inquired about whether an investigation has taken place to determine responsibility for the error and whether any internal control procedures have been implemented to prevent similar mistakes in the future. Mr. Brown attributed the error to employee turnover and the loss of institutional knowledge.

X. MAYOR ESPOSITO

1. Mayor Esposito noted that Bruster’s Ice Cream has tentatively scheduled their grand opening for October 10th.
2. Mayor Esposito informed everyone of the collaborated Shred Event with State Senator Suzy Glowiak Hilton that is set for October 12th.
3. Mayor Esposito stated that Wendy’s, located at 1S576 Midwest Road will undergo remodeling, including a complete transformation. He said the Public Hearing is scheduled for October 5th.
4. Mayor Esposito thanked everyone who helped with the 2024 Summer Concert Series.
5. Mayor Esposito stated that the auditing process will begin on September 23rd when the auditors begin conducting their initial on-site assessments.
6. Mayor Esposito noted that the transition phase of the new BS&A financial software program is starting to be implemented and we should be going live with the program sometime in mid-February.
7. Mayor Esposito wanted to open the discussion of the Holiday Luminaries so that information about them could be placed in the Terrace Leaves newsletter.

XI. COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE

1. **Discussion Of Traffic Patterns On MacArthur Drive**

Mayor Esposito provided an overview on the MacArthur Drive traffic project that included the newly drafted ordinance, the blinker crosswalk signs, and the speed humps.

Sergeant Hylton then explained the special detail that took place on MacArthur Drive with their unmarked police car monitoring the traffic during the time frame of September 6th to the 20th. He stated that during specific times, an officer was assigned to MacArthur Drive and Stillwell Road to observe the driving habits of those entering the neighborhood. He noted that they observed a total of 658 vehicles during that time, of which 416 turned into the subdivision, 111 vehicles went straight into Costco, 77 vehicles went eastbound on 22nd Street, and 54 turned westbound on 22nd Street. Sergeant Hylton also commented that during the special detail the officers who were assigned did not observe any speeding or traffic control sign violations.

Alderwoman Fitzgerald commented on the special detail completed by the police department and about the resident observations of the traffic, and outlined ways to move forward to assist with the residents' concerns.

Alderman Greco wanted to know if traffic could be prohibited from moving through the neighborhood if an accident happened on a major arterial street.

Alderman Beckwith commented on the specifics about the special detail, the outside influences on the traffic patterns, long-term strategies, goals, and about the speed humps.

City Council explained how they met with residents to help create a focus group and to create a community watch task force to address short-term goals that included; having crossing guards, lowering the speed limit to 20 mph, painting speed limits on the street, red and blue flashing lights for speeding, lighted signage, and putting reflective tape throughout the neighborhood, adding additional stop signs, and passing of the new ordinance. Long-term goals included gates and closing off the 22nd Street entrance. Further discussions ensued.

2. **Draft Ordinance Amending Schedule IV Entitled “Other Restrictions” Of Chapter 74 Entitled “Traffic Schedules” Of Title VII Entitled “Traffic Code” Of The Code Of Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois:**

Mayor Esposito asked the City Council to review the draft ordinance and memo prepared by Christopher B. Burke Engineering regarding the installation of “No Thru Traffic” on MacArthur Drive.

City Attorney Ramello further explained that the ordinance prohibits through traffic on MacArthur Drive, northbound and southbound from Karban Road to

Stillwell Road, between 9 A.M. and 9 P.M. and further explained that any traffic tickets that would be issued would be adjudicated locally.

Alderman Beckwith commented on the fine and other moving violations and asked for clarification on the time restrictions.

City Council further discussed this matter and recommended that the time frame be changed to begin from 7 A.M till 9 P.M.

City Council concurred to move to the consent agenda with the revised amendments.

3. **An Ordinance Amending Subsection B Of Section 10.20 Entitled “Administrative Adjudication Of Code Violations” Of Chapter 10 Entitled “General Provisions” Of Title I Entitled “General Provisions” Of The Code Of Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois:**

Mayor Esposito asked the City Council to review the draft ordinance regarding municipal adjudication for moving violations.

City Attorney Ramello explained the case referenced in the draft ordinance, which authorizes the city to use administrative adjudication for fines related to local traffic violations.

No questions asked.

City Council concurred to move to the subsequent Consent Agenda.

Alderman Greco commented on luminaires and complimented the banners that were put up at Albright Middle School.

Alderman Beckwith also complimented on the banners for Albright Middle School, and thanked the Police Department for attending the meeting and answering all of the questions and commenting on the great job that the police department does.

Alderman Vlach reminded everyone that the city will be hosting garage sales in 2025.

City Administrator Ritz provided an update on the recent grant applications the city has applied for, and on the Strategic Plan. City Administrator Ritz then spoke about and complimented the Friday Night Concert series and about the wonderful comments he received from concertgoers all the way from Iowa, Indiana, and Michigan who came out to enjoy the great bands that played. He then congratulated and recognized Sergeant Michael Hylton on his twenty (20) years of dedicated police services to the City of Oakbrook Terrace.

ORDINANCE NO. 24 - 35

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SUBSECTION B OF SECTION 10.20 ENTITLED
“ADMINISTRATIVE ADJUDICATION OF CODE VIOLATIONS” OF CHAPTER 10
ENTITLED “GENERAL PROVISIONS” OF TITLE I ENTITLED “GENERAL
PROVISIONS” OF THE CODE OF OAKBROOK TERRACE, ILLINOIS**

WHEREAS, the City of Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois (the “City”) is a home-rule unit of local government under Article VII, Section 6 of the 1970 Illinois Constitution, and, except as limited by such section, it may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs;

WHEREAS, the City is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, as from time to time supplemented and amended;

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City (the “Corporate Authorities”) are charged with the responsibility of protecting the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City;

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have the authority to adopt ordinances to promulgate rules, regulations or policies pertaining to its government and affairs;

WHEREAS, on April 4, 2024, the Illinois Supreme Court issued a ruling in a case entitled *Cammacho v. The City of Joliet*, 2024 IL 129263 (Ill. 2024) clarifying the authority of home-rule municipalities to use administrative adjudication processes to assess fines for violations of traffic ordinances;

WHEREAS, prior to the Illinois Supreme Court recent decision in *Cammacho*, the First District Appellate Court had held that home-rule municipalities, such as the City, lacked jurisdiction to administratively adjudicate ordinance violations for any offense under the Illinois Vehicle Code or any “similar offense that is a traffic regulation governing the movement of vehicles.” *Catom Trucking, Inc. v. City of Chicago*, 2011 Ill. App. 101146 (Ill. App. Ct. 2011);

WHEREAS, the Illinois Supreme Court’s recent decision in *Cammacho* holding that home-rule municipalities may use administrative adjudication processes to enforce their ordinances, including for “moving violations” overruled the *Catom Trucking, Inc.* decision;

WHEREAS, the Illinois Supreme Court went on to hold that the city of Joliet, however, was precluded from using its administrative processes to adjudicate the ordinance violations in question because the city code required that “reportable offenses of the Illinois Vehicle Code” be adjudicated in the circuit court”;

WHEREAS, currently Section 10.20(B) of the Code of Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois, similar to the city of Joliet code, limits the City’s administrative adjudication process to traffic regulations except any offense that is a traffic regulation governing the movement of motor vehicles or a reportable offense under § 6-204 of the Illinois Vehicle Code; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities find it necessary, desirable and in the best interests of the City that Section 10.20(B) of the Code of Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois, be amended to authorize the City’s Code Hearing Unit to enforce violations of traffic regulations governing the movement of motor vehicles or a reportable offense under § 6-204 of the Illinois Vehicle Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Oakbrook Terrace, DuPage County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1: The above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct by the Corporate Authorities and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety in this Section 1.

Section 2: Subsection B of Section 10.20 entitled “Administrative Adjudication of Code Violations” of Chapter 10 entitled “General Provisions” of Title I Entitled “General Provisions” of the Code of Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois, as amended, shall be and is hereby further amended to read as follows:

(B)(1) Creation of Code Hearing Unit; Jurisdiction. There is hereby created within the City an executive unit of the City’s government to be known as the “City of Oakbrook Terrace Code Hearing Unit,” which is authorized to provide for and operate a “system of administrative adjudication,” for adjudication of violations contained in the following chapters of the City’s code, as now in effect or hereafter adopted or amended:

- (a) Chapter 35 Taxes;
- (b) Chapter 50 Public and Private Sewer Collection Systems;
- (c) Chapter 51 Solid Waste Disposal and Recycling;
- (d) Chapter 52 Water Supply Systems;
- (e) Chapter 53 Trees on City Property;
- (f) Chapter 70 General Provisions;
- (g) Chapter 71 Traffic Regulations;
- (h) Chapter 72 Parking Regulations;
- (i) Chapter 73 Snow Emergency;
- (j) Chapter 75 Parking Schedule;

- (w) Chapter 119 Massage;
- (x) Chapter 121 Rental Dwellings;
- (y) Chapter 122 Adult Uses;
- (z) Chapter 126 Unscheduled Intercity Buses;
- (aa) Chapter 150 Codes and Regulations Governing Construction of Buildings and Structures;
- (ab) Chapter 152 Stormwater Management and Flood Plain Development;
- (ac) Chapter 153 Demolition;

Section 3: The officials, officers, employees and attorneys of the City are hereby authorized to take all actions necessary to carry out, give effect to and consummate the regulations herein enacted, and to take all action reasonably required in conformity therewith.

Section 4: This ordinance, and its parts, are declared to be severable; and if any sentence, section, paragraph, sub-paragraph, clause, provision or portion of this ordinance is declared unconstitutional, invalid or unenforceable, said shall be excluded and deemed inoperative or unenforceable, as though not provided for herein, and shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other part of this ordinance, which shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect. It is hereby declared to be the express legislative intent of the Corporate Authorities that this ordinance would have been authorized and adopted as if no such unconstitutional, invalid or unenforceable part was included in this ordinance.

Section 5: All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 6: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect ten (10) days following its passage, approval and publication in accordance with law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE PROVISIONS OF TITLE XI (BUSINESS REGULATIONS); CHAPTER 124 (VIDEO GAMING); SUBCHAPTER 124.22 (NUMBER OF LICENSES) OF THE CODE OF OAKBROOK TERRACE TO INCREASE THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF VIDEO GAMING LOCATION LICENSES AND THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF VIDEO GAMING TERMINAL LICENSES (TERRACE CANTINA, INC., D/B/A TERRACE CANTINA, 17W615 BUTTERFIELD ROAD)

WHEREAS, the City of Oakbrook Terrace (the “City”) is a home-rule unit of local government under Article VII, Section 6 of the 1970 Illinois Constitution and, except as limited by such Section, it may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs;

WHEREAS, Section 124.22(A) of the Code of Oakbrook Terrace establishes the number of Video Gaming Location Licenses, and such number may, from time to time, be increased by formal action of the City Council to make available for the Liquor Commissioner to consider granting a Video Gaming Location License for a new and deserving business enterprise which seeks a Video Gaming Location License;

WHEREAS, Section 124.22(B) of the Code of Oakbrook Terrace establishes the number of Video Gaming Terminal Licenses, and such number may, from time to time, be increased by formal action of the City Council to make available for the Liquor Commissioner to consider granting a Video Gaming Terminal License for a new and deserving business enterprise which seeks a Video Gaming Terminal License; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is desirable to increase the maximum number of Video Gaming Location Licenses and increase the maximum number of Video Gaming Terminal Licenses to enable the Liquor Commissioner to consider issuing a Video Gaming Terminal License and Video Gaming Terminal Licenses to, Terrace Cantina, Inc., D/B/A Terrace Cantina to authorize the installation and use of video gaming devices in the premises at 17W615 Butterfield Road and to encourage increased general economic activity and tourism within the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Oakbrook Terrace, DuPage County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 2. Section 124.22, entitled “Number of Licenses” of the City of Oakbrook Terrace Code of Ordinances, shall be amended to read as follows:

(A) The total number of Video Gaming Location Licenses issued under this chapter article shall not exceed twenty (20).

(B) The total number of Video Gaming Terminal Licenses for Video Gaming Terminals issued under this chapter article shall not exceed one hundred and nineteen (119).

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SCHEDULE IV ENTITLED "OTHER RESTRICTIONS" OF CHAPTER 74 ENTITLED "TRAFFIC SCHEDULES" OF TITLE VII ENTITLED "TRAFFIC CODE" OF THE CODE OF OAKBROOK TERRACE, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the City of Oakbrook Terrace (the "City") is a home-rule unit of local government under Article VII, Section 6 of the 1970 Illinois Constitution and, except as limited by such Section, it may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs;

WHEREAS, Section 11-208 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/11-208) expressly empowers the corporate authorities of the City to regulate motor vehicle traffic with respect to every way publicly maintained open to the use of the public for purposes of vehicular travel under its exclusive jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, the City Engineer, having studied the existing travel patterns of the public ways of MacArthur Drive, 22nd Street, Orchard Place, Karban Road, Elm Place, Eisenhower Road, Halsey Road, Stillwell Road and Butterfield Road and, after due consideration for the health, safety and general welfare of the City residents and businesses, for the non-resident traveling public and for the existing travel patterns of the public ways issued a Memorandum dated June 30, 2023, and has determined that the vehicular and pedestrian traffic volume at the intersections of MacArthur Drive and 22nd Street and MacArthur Drive and Butterfield Road necessitates additional traffic regulation in that area and has recommended that:

1. Northbound MacArthur Drive from Karban Road to Stillwell Road be designated as "No Thru Traffic to Stillwell Road 9 AM – 9 PM"; and
2. Southbound MacArthur Drive from Stillwell Road to Karban Road be designated as "No Thru Traffic to Karban Road 9 AM – 9 PM";

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities of the City having thoroughly reviewed the recommendation of the City Engineer determine that it is in the interest of public safety and convenience of the residents of the City and the traveling public to designate MacArthur Drive in both direction of travel between Karban Road to Stillwell Road as "No Thru Traffic between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m."; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City, convenience of the residents of the City and the traveling public to amend Schedule IV entitled "Other Restrictions" of Chapter 74 entitled "Traffic schedules" of Title VII entitled "Traffic Code" of the Code of Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois, to control the volume and travel of traffic on MacArthur Drive between Karban Road to Stillwell Road in the manner hereinafter set forth;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Oakbrook Terrace, DuPage County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1: The facts and statements contained in the preambles to this ordinance are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted and incorporated by reference as part of this ordinance as though fully set forth herein.

Section 2: Schedule IV entitled “Other Restrictions” of Chapter 74 entitled “Traffic Schedules” of Title VII entitled “Traffic Code” of the Code of Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

SCHEDULE IV. OTHER RESTRICTIONS.

(A) It shall be unlawful to operate any vehicle on any street listed in this schedule in violation of the restriction so designated.

The penalty for a violation of the restriction against through traffic shall be a fine of \$100. The Penalty for a violation of other restrictions in this Schedule IV, see § 10.99

Section 3: The City Administrator shall be and is hereby authorized and directed to cause the appropriate signs conforming to the requirements of Section 11-304 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/11-304), Section 71.08 of the Code of Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois, and the *National Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways* (11th Edition, revised December 2023) supplemented by the *Illinois Supplement to the National Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways* (Revision 3, November 2021 Edition) issued by the Illinois Department of Transportation to be erected, as necessary: (1) at the intersection of northbound MacArthur Drive at 22nd Street as “No Thru Traffic Ahead - MacArthur Drive”; (2) at the intersection of northbound MacArthur Drive at Karban Road as “No Thru Traffic to Stillwell Road 7:00 a.m.– 9:00 p.m. Fine \$100”; (3) at the intersection of southbound MacArthur Drive at Butterfield Road as “No Thru Traffic Ahead - MacArthur Drive”; and (4) at the intersection of southbound MacArthur Drive at Stillwell Road as “No Thru Traffic to Karban Road 7:00 a.m. – 9:00 p.m. Fine \$100”

Section 4: If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this ordinance.

Section 5: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 6: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect ten (10) days from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form and following the erection of appropriate signage as authorized herein and required by law.
